When Pat was referred to us, he was working through some anxiety and aggression and he would get increasingly anxious in specific environments. Eventually, his team started to notice a pattern of what made him anxious and more aggressive. Unfortunately, before changes were made, Pat was arrested and went to jail for two weeks. During this time, the Bridges team was fighting hard to get Pat back. They knew that for his well-being, it was important he received help from a provider that he trusted.

After the judge gave Bridges approval, the staff went to visit Pat and moved him to one of our crisis sites. As Pat approached them, there was a huge smile on his face and his eyes began to tear up and said "You didn't give up on me", which is something that the staff members will never forget.

When they picked him up from jail, he said "I never want to go back there", and after that moment, Pat continued to do very well. His medication was regulated, he stayed busy participating in activities he enjoyed like snow blowing, weed wacking and fixing things around the house.

He then moved out of the crisis home and into one of our residential houses. He has become an amazing mentor for the other two people that he lives with. Pat often says that he likes to mentor them since he can see a bit of his younger self in them.

Since then, Pat started working with our Employment Services team and was placed with the Property crew, which he absolutely loves! He has had so many successes, and all of them were due to him deciding to make better choices on his own. He still calls that same staff member once a week to chat about life and update them on what book he is currently reading. We are so proud of Pat and excited to see where the future takes him!

Rumi's Michael and Katie attended the Night to Shine Prom this year where thousands of people come together to honor those with disabilities. Michael and Katie had a wonderful time!

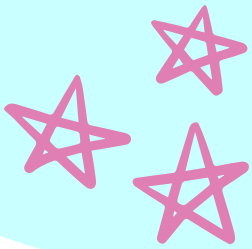


Garry had the opportunity to go to Alan Page's "Testify" art exhibit at the Minneapolis Central Library!

The kids from NorthBridge Child Development have been having so much fun learning about winter activities and playing in the snow! We have welcomed some new friends and opened our infant room!

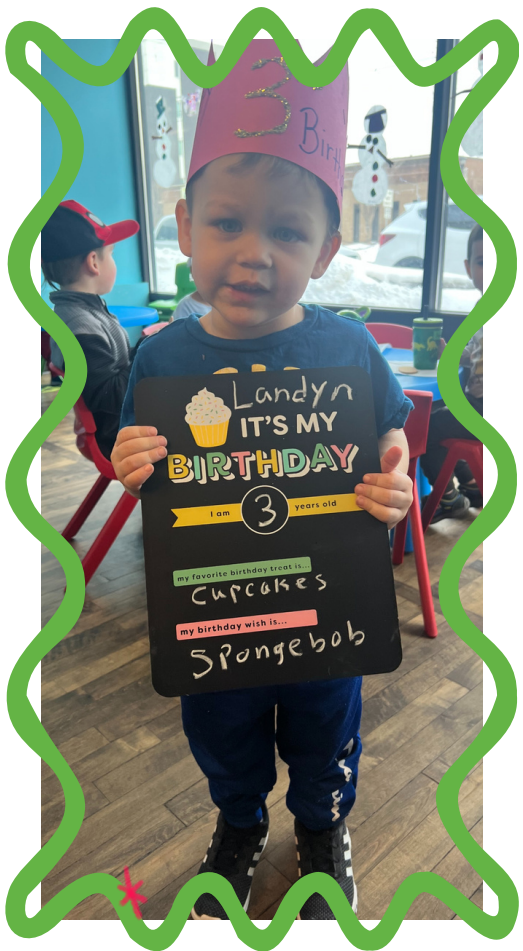
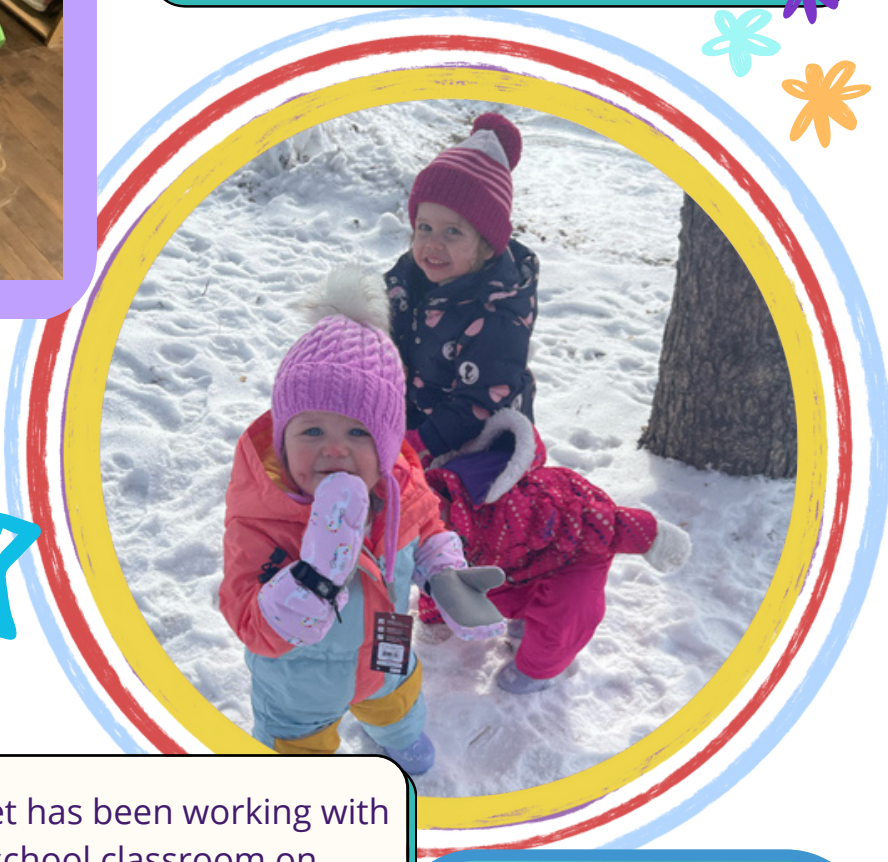
